Discuss the possibility of working with local organizations on the ReLeaf Grant

During parks committee this month, we were approached by Yuba Sutter Arts and Yuba County Rotary about the possibility of a grant through the California ReLeaf program. They are proposing an urban reforestation and natural resource education project for South Yuba County. They feel OPUD would be a great partner in this due to our management of Olivehurst parks that would likely benefit from this program.

This grant is a reimbursement type grant. YSA is asking that OPUD front the costs of the project (\$100,000) to complete this project, with reimbursement coming from California ReLeaf in the future.

California ReLeaf Grant Project for South Yuba County

Yuba Sutter Arts and South Yuba County Rotary were approached by California ReLeaf and offered a \$100,000 grant to plant trees in flood impacted areas in and around Olivehurst.

California ReLeaf works statewide to promote alliances among community-based groups, individuals, industry, and government agencies, encouraging each to contribute to the livability of our cities and the protection of our environment by planting and caring for trees.

California ReLeaf envisions a vital network of grassroots groups working in partnership with each other, businesses, and local governments across the state. Through these efforts, an educated public will treasure the value of the urban forest as integral to the quality of life, economic well-being, and a sustainable global environment. Citizens are motivated by an appreciation of the beauty and diversity that characterize the nation's most populous state and have filled all communities with trees that live long, healthy lives.

Project Description

In partnership with California ReLeaf, the Yuba Sutter Arts Council (YSA) proposes an urban forest restoration and natural resources education project for South Yuba County. YSA would need to bring in significant local partner organization support to be part of the project. In addition, it will engage the services of a technical expert on the selection of tree species and for guidance on planting and maintaining the trees.
